If I got to make a chocolate factory

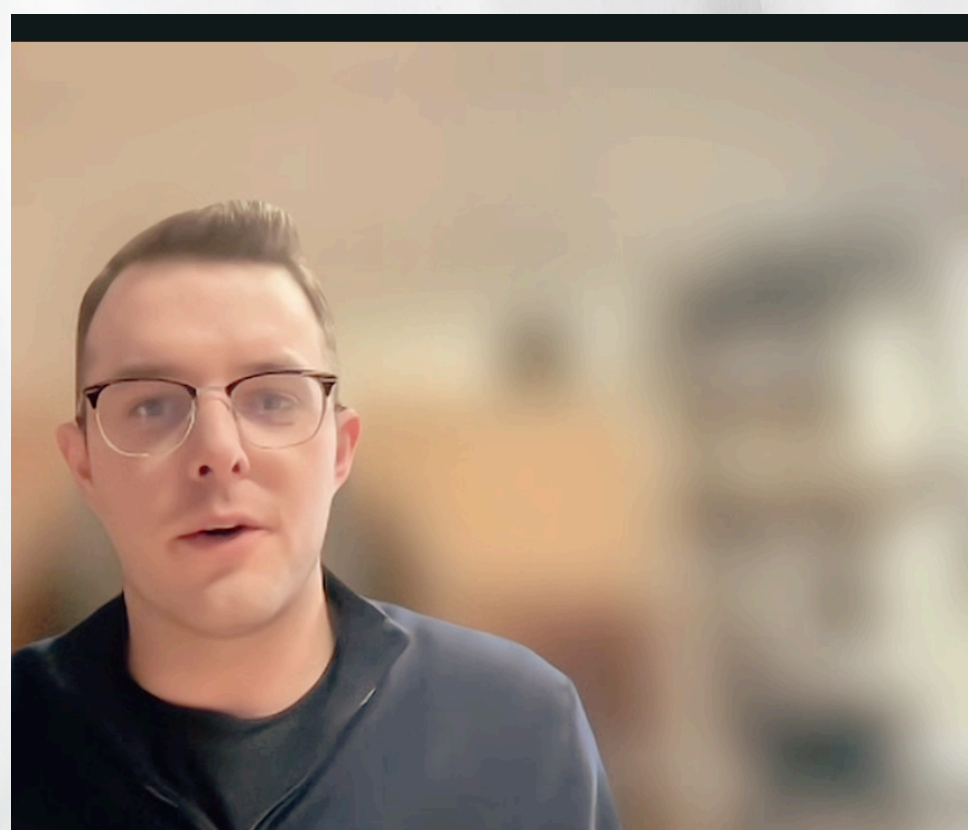
